



Meet the Members: Robert (Bob) Clevenger

I grew up in Scottsdale, Arizona, and went to Arizona State University. My major was Journalism, but I had minors in Architecture and Marketing. Architecture is a functional art and uses forms and voids, light and darkness, and often reflects the culture (including art) of the time in which it was built. My love of photography began in college, and I ran the photography lab in my senior year.



My work was in the area of resource conservation for utilities. Many of the opportunities for saving electricity came from lighting, and I took a number of courses in lighting over the years. I learned about CRI (color rendering index) and light source color temperature which actually changes throughout the day with the sun ranging from what we characterize as warm in the morning and evening to mid-day when it is very complete in rendering colors. For photography there is a "magic time" before the sun fully rises when colors are expressed completely but shadows are not strong.



A few years ago I took a course in nature photography, and when we moved to our Fiddletown property the wild flowers captivated me, and I began photography again to capture their beauty.

early January and open to the public as soon as our displays are up. So, watch this space and elsewhere for that news.


This location has a separate area for framing but, until we are fully operational, continue
