

John Peck is the featured artist for November. A self-taught landscape, wildlife, still life, and portraiture artist currently residing in Sutter Creek, CA, his website is detailexpressionsinoil.com

Born in Marin County, California, he had a calling to public service and law enforcement from a very young age as there is a long narrative of police and military service in his family history. Peck has received many awards and accolades in his over 40 year law enforcement career.



Throughout his life, Peck has felt a passion for self-expression, art, and oil painting. He is inspired by the works of John Singer Sargent along with the works of impressionists Renoir, Degas, and others. Peck is presently inspired by current artists such as Michael James Smith and Mark Carder. One of his lifelong thrills was to get a personalized tour of the

Uffizi Gallery in Florence, Italy where the works of the Italian Renaissance were elucidated. As a lifelong backpacker and nature enthusiast, Peck captures his experiences in oil through is interpretive work with light and perspective. He is fervent about detail in his work as he believes that attention to the finest detail brings an overall positive outcome. Peck was awarded first place at the 2019 Amador County Fair in the professional division in oil/ acrylic landscape.

"It all began in kindergarten, Redlands, CA, when I overheard my teacher tell my mother that my paintings were exceptional," Bonnie Breeze recalls as she prepares for her November show at Gallery 10, Sutter Creek. Since that time, as a third grader, Bonnie started drawing trees, and in eighth grade her teacher gave her extra time to do art. She was recommended by that teacher to the high school to be allowed to take advanced art as a freshman. Onward and forward, Bonnie became an Art-Drama major in University and later a major in Elementary Education.



Bonnie began her teaching career at age twenty-one and continued teaching elementary school until her retirement in 2001. She continued her interest in visual and performing arts throughout her years of teaching and family life, and she expressed it in a variety of genres within her teaching.

"Serendipity" is Bonnie's first show since locating to Sutter Creek in 2010. It is representative of many of the directions Bonnie has gone in the last twelve years.
